What is the Warren County Health District's process for COVID-19 cases?

• The Warren County Health District staff strives to call each person who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 to assist with isolation and help identify close contacts who may need to quarantine. Isolation and quarantine are the only tools we have to help slow the spread of COVID-19, until a vaccine is available.

I have COVID-19 and the Warren County Health District hasn't called me?

• Due to the high volume of daily reported cases, the Health District has implemented a system where a person testing positive for COVID-19 will get a letter in the US mail. The letter system will help the Health District get information to people diagnosed with COVID-19 in a timely manner when volume of reported cases exceeds the amount that can be called.

I received a letter from the Health District, now what?

- Please follow instructions received in the letter: stay home, monitor your symptoms, stay away from others.
- Identify who you may have been in close contact with and share the quarantine letter that was enclosed with your isolation letter.
